

INTRODUCTION TO SCRIPTURE

Course Description

This course provides the participant with a basic introduction to the Bible including its format and structure, an overview of the books and the genres of writing, and the critical tools for interpretation. It also explores Old and New Testament themes along with key documents of the Church. Integral to each session is prayer, course content, faith sharing, and large/small group discussion so that participants can apply the teachings to their life and ministry.
